After serving an orthopedic residency at the University of California, San Diego, he completed an upper extremity and microvascular fellowship at the renowned Indiana Hand Center. Dr. Cohen was the 2017 ASHT Conference keynote speaker.

Dr. Fernandez is one of the nation's leading innovators in technology for hand and wrist injuries. His research has led to minimally invasive procedures with excellent outcomes. He graduated salutatorian honors from medical school and completed his residency and fellowship at the distinguished University of Pittsburgh Medical Center and Indiana Hand Center, both ranked among the top programs in the nation. Dr. Fernandez is a Golden Apple Award winner for excellence in teaching.
